The impact of The Cornell Hotel School and The Cornell Hotel Society in Europe, Middle East & Africa.

The start of CHS European Chapter.

Beginning in the 1950s many Cornell Hotel School graduates fulfilled their military service in Europe, primarily in post-war Germany, where they operated hotels and military clubs. Already in 1958 Johan Krohn '56 suggested to the Society and the School to form a CHS Chapter in Europe. When Frank A. Ready Jr. '36 settled in Frankfurt as VP with Dunham & Smith Inc. he followed up the idea to form a European chapter of Cornell Hotel School alumni ("hotelies") working in Europe, the Middle East, and North Africa, together with expatriate hotelies who stayed overseas after their military service. Incidentally, Frank A. Ready '36 had also been instrumental in forming the Japan Chapter a few years earlier.

The Inauguration.

On **February 4, 1961,** the inaugural meeting took place in the presence of Dean **Howard B. Meek,** his later successor **Robert A. Beck '42,** Cornell School Professors

Bernatsky and **Wanderstock** and graduates representing their home countries: Cyprus, Egypt, England, France, Greece, Germany, Holland, Iceland, India, Italy, Lebanon, Lichtenstein, Morocco, Norway, Sweden, Switzerland and Turkey as well as USA. **Curt Strand '43,** Vice President Hilton International Europe, held the welcoming address and **Ichiro Inumaru '53,** Owner of Imperial Hotel Tokyo, brought greetings from the **Japan Chapter**, the first CSH chapter formed outside America.

The Board met with advisor **Frank A. Ready '36** to establish the purpose and goal of the **European Chapter**, which was defined as assisting the Cornell Hotel School in whatever ways possible including the following:

- 1. Encourage students from Europe to attend the Hotel School.
- Plan and direct a Public-Relation program in Europe to enhance the prestige of the Hotel School, then the "Cornell Society of Hotelmen" [now CHS the "Cornell Hotel Society"], and the European Chapter (for members in Europe, the Middle East and North-Africa).
- 3. Assist the Hotel School in interviewing prospective students and attend special hospitality events and functions as representatives of the School.
- 4. Arrange social functions (on behalf of Cornell Society of Hotelmen) in connection with hospitality industry conventions, shows and events.

Swiss relations that created early focus on the Hotel School.

Dr. Oscar Michel '31, Swiss hotel owner and banker, was one of the first European students to attend The School. He often told how much he owed the studies at Cornell for his success in evaluation-service for banks and real estate firms on appraisal of hotel operations and physical plants. His efforts in creating interest for the Schools programs were invaluable. His generosity was legendary; like when in 1972 he invited the entire European Chapter group to celebrate his 70th birthday over the weekend at his Euler Hotel in Basel.

Ruedi Schelbert '55 returning to Switzerland after studies and practice in the US, had at first difficulties finding a satisfactory position. But then, when the BAUR AU LAC, Zurich in 1957 had bought a new NCR accounting machine, the Swiss NCR people had never seen it before and could not instruct the operation. Ruedi had practiced the operation of NCR machines at Cornell and knew it perfectly well and was therefore chosen among the many applicants for the position as Assistant to the GM (Vice-Director) proving that the years of studies at Cornell had been rewarding. Ruedi later became a prominent Swiss hotelier, as GM of many leading hotels, helping greatly to further the reputation of the Cornell Hotel School.

The Swiss Hotel Association (Schweizer Hotelier Verein) recognizing Ruedi's education asked him to participate in a commission to give new directions to the Swiss Hotel School in Lausanne, the oldest in the world. The ideas and concepts his group presented were, however, at the time rejected by the "traditionalists". But during the next decade or so Swiss and other European institutions started to adapt the principles used by the Cornell Hotel School. When the Lausanne School moved to new locations in the 70ies **Peter Streuli '62** was project manager for the planning of the new facilities and **Elisabeth Tresch '73** was involved in the operational planning.

Annual meetings.

From the start the plan to get together once a year at an "annual meeting" was a great success. That event soon developed into a three-day extravaganza of educational, networking, and social functions—in other words, a mix of business and fun. While the focus is always on education and networking—there's some competition to out-do the social aspects of the previous year's meeting. The meeting was and continues to be the cornerstone of CHS networking outside North America. The meeting venue moves from country to country each year in order to reach members in the various parts of the EMEA Region, shifting annually: Central — North - Central — South, from London, Paris, Berlin, Zurich, Munich, Brussels and Vienna in the Central, to Rovaniemi/Helsinki, Bergen, Copenhagen, Stockholm, Oslo, Stavanger in the North and Athens, Cyprus, Florence, Rome, Tel Aviv, Dubrovnik and Cairo in the South, Budapest and St. Petersburg in the East and Lisbon in the West.

Legendary organizers **Deiv Salutskij '71**, with four meetings in Finland, one in St. Petersburg and one in Reykjavik and **Evan Pezas '72** with three meetings in Athens and a cruise have come up with spectacular and adventurous events. The word of success soon got around, attracting attendance from members in USA and Asia, and later became model for similar events in the other regions.

The deans of The School starting with Dean **Robert A. Beck** have made it a tradition to attend the annual meetings together with the Alumni Director, adding prestige to the events. With faculty professors and lecturers, informing of the latest trends in the hospitality business and bringing news from The School the educational programs have been highlights where local business leaders have been invited. The annual meetings are important for maintaining the ties to The School and are instrumental in keeping the togetherness among the EMEA members.

After the Inauguration, annual meetings started. We have posted pictures from the events, with the first available picture from the meeting in Stockholm 1965.



Erik was a true helmsman for Cornell Hotel School in Norway, establishing annual seminars with professors from The School at his Solstrand Fjordhotel. He also was instrumental in negotiating an agreement for the *Norwegian School of Hotel Management* to send students to Cornell for a one-year study. Starting in 1991, by 2010 nearly 100 students had completed this study. It was a great loss for Cornell Hotel School and the Norwegian Hotel Industry when Erik passed away in 1992 at the age of 46. His will had a scholarship fund to benefit study at Cornell Hotel School. The Norwegian Hotel Industry established an Erik Schau–Larsen Memorial Scholarship equivalent to one million dollars. The European Chapter also established a Memorial Scholarship in Erik's name.





NATIONAL CHAPTERS in EUROPE.

From the very beginning the *European Chapter* included CHS members and Affiliate members from the **Middle East and Africa** areas named the **EMEA Region**. By the mid 90ies the total membership in the EMEA Region had increased to over 600. The annual meeting was the only event where members could meet each other for networking and educational purpose. Due to many various reasons, cost, timing etc. it was not possible to gather the many members. The attendance varied depending on location. It was therefore suggested to form local chapters where members could meet and keep in touch locally all year round: **Chapters, with a Board that could represent the School and the Alumni Office, to fulfil the same purpose and goal as defined for the European Chapter at the outset in 1961.**

At the General meeting in **St. Petersburg 1998** it was decided to approve national chapters that had been formed and formation of new chapters. The European Chapter with President and Board was maintained as an umbrella organization for the national chapters. Members in countries without a chapter would come directly under the European Chapter Board. The Regional Vice President for Europe, Middle East & Africa would serve as a liaison to the Executive Committee of the Society. In 2000 it was decided to combine the European Chapter President position with that of the Regional Vice President. The European Chapter name thereby faded away and all CHS activities came under the EMEA Region.

Also, at the St. Petersburg meeting an offer from the **Alumni Office** to handle invoice mailing for collection of dues and maintaining the membership rooster was accepted. The Affiliate members that had paid dues to the European Chapter would now pay dues to the Society and become fully fledged members of **The CHS Society**, without requirement of 6 courses of PDP that recently had been amended to the **Society's Bylaws**. Participants at the **General Manager Program** are automatically members of the CHS Society for one year as part of the program and may thereafter continue as dues paying members.

When Michael Chiu '66 became CHS President in 1995 he had already realized these needs and consequently helped form the French and the Pan Hellenic chapters and when Rudy Münster '62 succeeded him in 1996 a German Chapter was launched. As Regional Vice President and later CHS President, Leif R. Evensen '66 helped form one chapter after the other over the years, London, Norway, Sweden, Finland with Russia and the Baltics,

Benelux, Switzerland, in addition to Austria, that became part of the German Chapter. With the help of Roberto Wirth '75 and Carmel D'Arienzo '88, an Italian chapter was planned. Instead, however, assisted by Chris Bergen and Ivica Cacic MPS '98, the AlpAdria Chapter was formed to include Italy, Austria. Switzerland. Croatia. and Slovenia with Roberto as the President.

At the meeting in St. Petersburg in 1998 an agreement was made with the Alumni Office that a surplus of dues payment from the European Chapter members, after deduction of maintenance fee to the administration of the Alumni Office, should be transferred to European scholarship funds. At the meeting in Florence 2002 it was agreed that some of the money also be made available to the European Treasury as working capital for the local organizers in the planning stage of the annual meeting before collection of meeting fees come in. Also be available for other urgent matters.

Affiliate Membership.

The newly formed **European Chapter** in **1961** soon decided to make persons who completed courses at "Summer School", (now PDP), eligible for Affiliate Membership when demonstrating a genuine interest in the growth and activities of the chapter and after approval by its **Board of Directors**. In the years to come this decision provided a source of devoted affiliate members that counted for the success and strength in the development of the European Chapter, Members like Joaquin Paredes Alves Affil. '57, Lisbon: Fred Tschanz Affil. '57, Zurich; Dominik Betschart Affil. '63, Zurich; Sven Akerstrand Affil. '64, Stockholm; Jürgen Wolf Affil. '69, Dortmund and Niels Olsen Affil. 71, Copenhagen, all instrumental in making successful Annual Meetings possible in their areas. Others like Christian Petzold Affil. '67, Helmut Strondl Affil. '68; Charles Williams Affil. '68 and Heinz Schumacher **Affil. '71** contributed serving as Officers on the European Chapter Board. The Affiliates members have continued to play an even more important part after the formation of national European chapters started up in 1995, to mention a few: Thomas Tritschler Affil '92 as President of the German Chapter and his successor Andreas Martin Affil '97, as well as Mario Kiefer Affil '74, Philippe Bijaoui IMHI '92 and Dr. Wolf Wagschal Affil'96 as members of local chapter boards and the Regional Board.

The European Fund-Raising Activities. The Summer School Scholarship Program.

In 1964 a scholarship program was started to help young promising European hoteliers attend "Summer School", now the Professional Development Program (PDP). The first scholarship was realized thanks to the generous donation by dean Robert Beck '42 on behalf of the Hotel School.

The following year, the program picked up speed with four recipient attending courses in the then seven-week program which was operated during June and July. In 1967 there were seven recipients and by 1977 there were fifteen. According to recipients, studies at Cornell changed their life and started them on a successful hotel career. Many later became prominent leaders in the hospitality industry, like **Dieter Huckestein Affil. '68**, CEO of Hilton Hotels and President of IH&RA; **Thomas Wachs Affil '69**, Maritim Hotels and **Emanuel Berger Affil. '70**, who was named **HOTELS Magazine Hotelier of the World 2004**, just to mention a few.

The driving force behind the Summer School scholarship program from its inception in 1964 was **Rudy Münster'62.** For 26 years Rudy devoted a tremendous amount of time enthusiastically soliciting scholarships and administering the program. Contributions to the scholarships have come from suppliers to the industry, hotel companies in addition to regular generous contributions from the European members.

In 1990 **Deiv Salutskij '71** took over the responsibility and has since led the program to new heights. In total scholarship funds for more than \$600.000 were collected and awarded to over 600 recipients **by 2006.**

In 2010 started a special PDP Scholarship in memory of Leif Thorné PDP '73.

The main European Scholarships.

In 1984 the creation of an **endowed European Chapter Scholarship** to benefit full-time European students in the undergraduate and Master programs was approved. **Peter Streuli '62** was a driving force behind the start of this fundraising and thanks to the generosity of the many Chapter members the scholarship fund was endowed already in 1985. The drive did not stop there, the next was a fully endowed Memorial scholarship for **Ralph Starke '52** and his wife Wilma, the beloved "Billie". No sooner was a Memorial scholarship

for **Erik Schau-Larsen '73** fully endowed in 2005, before the collection of a new one started up. In addition, through the generosity of **John Mariani (Hon.)**, a **European Banfi Scholarship** of **\$500.000** was established in 2004.

There are presently **five EMEA Endowed Scholarships** totalling **USD 1.238.000**, all administrated by **SHA**. In 2016 the *EMEA Region PDP Scholarship* was renamed the *CHS Deiv Salutskij EMEA PDP Scholarship*, honoring his tremendous contribution over the past decades to the CHS EMEA region for raising scholarship funds, by soliciting and as MC at the traditional **Deiv's Auction**.



In 1988 The Chapter contributed \$ 120.000 to the *Legacy of Leadership* for the renovation of lecture room 217, renamed the *European Chapter Room*. Here, *Tord Moe Laeskogen '96*, *Liv Knudsen Braathen '93* and *Christina Staalstrom '95* pointing to the listing among "President's Circle Contributors" to the *Leadership Campaign* on the plaque outside the School Library.

How the CHS EMEA Chapters can support GMP scholarships!

The **General Managers Program (GMP)** at Cornell Hotel School is considered by **CHS EMEA** extremely important for the promotion of The School. The executives attending have been important ambassadors for Cornell. They are active members, and many are Board members in the CHS EMEA chapters. We recommend the CHS EMEA chapters to follow the example of **Chapter Norway**, that together with **HSMAI Chapter Norway**, in 2003 started an annual **"Young Hotelier of the Year" Award**, with the winner attending the General Managers Program, funding provided by contribution from partners

in the hospitality, hotel, and travel industry. It turned out to be a great success, so as a result, in 2010 a "Hotelier of the Year" Award was started for established hotel executives

Deiv has organized a total of 6 European meetings and Leif 4 over the years! **Liv Gussing Burgess '91** became **CHS Global President 2013.** As of **2016** she is the **CHS Foundation President**.

Deniz Omurgunelsen '00 became CHS Global President 2015.




